### CALL TO ORDER AND ROLL CALL

Committee Chair Smith Fano called the meeting to order. Ms. Navia Lobo called the roll and announced a quorum of the OECI Committee was present.

## **ACTION ITEMS**

- A) Approval of Summary Minutes:
- Operations, External Communications and Inter-Governmental Committee Meeting of October 24, 2018

Mr. Meyer moved to approve the Summary Minutes. Ms. Boord seconded the motion. The motion was unanimously approved.

- B) MDX Procurement/Contract Number ITB-19-04; MDX Work Program No. 40045.060 Construction Services for Wrong Way Safety Program (\$2,200,000 Estimate)
- Approval to Advertise

Mr. Toledo introduced the item by explaining that this procurement is the result of a successful trial program implemented to prevent vehicles from entering the MDX off-ramps from the wrong direction. The safety devices were installed at four locations (NW 137<sup>th</sup> Avenue at SR 836, NW 37<sup>th</sup> Avenue at SR 924, 107<sup>th</sup> Avenue at SR 836 and Killian Parkway at SR 874) and proved to be effective in identifying and preventing wrong way access. Based on the positive results, staff requested Committee approval to advertise an Invitation to Bid (ITB) requesting bids from qualified Contractors to provide construction services for MDX Project No. 40045.060, which will consist of the continuation of the Wrong Way Safety Program ("Project"). The Project will install the Wrong Way Prevention System at an additional 21 locations system wide. Mr. Toledo further explained the construction services will include all labor, materials, equipment, traffic control, and incidentals necessary for the installation of enhanced signage and pavement markings. It will also include solar powered flashing LED wrong way signage that will be activated by a radar system and will send a notification and verification photos to the MDX's Traffic Control Center of the vehicle travelling in the wrong direction.

The Engineer's cost estimate for this Project is \$2,200,000 and its estimated duration is 365 Calendar Days.

Mr. Boord moved to approve the advertisement for this ITB. Mr. Meyer seconded the motion. The motion was unanimously approved.

- C) MDX Work Program No. 92404 SR 924 Extension West to the Homestead Extension of the Florida Turnpike (\$5,792,000)
- Endorsement of a Locally Funded Agreement (LFA) with Florida's Turnpike Enterprise (FTE) to Facilitate the Construction of MDX Ramp Bridges 1, 2 and 3 Substructure by FTE and the Construction of the 92404 Interchange on FTE ROW by MDX.

MDX and FTE have been coordinating the conceptual design of additional ramp movements between SR 924 (NW 138<sup>th</sup> Street) and the Homestead Extension of the Florida Turnpike (HEFT) as part of MDX Project No. 92404. To ensure the timely completion of the interchange; to minimize the impacts to existing traffic; and to reduce "throw away costs" due to future re-work, MDX and FTE agree that it is in the best interest of the public for MDX to provide FTE funding to construct the substructure for the future MDX Ramp Bridges 1, 2 and 3. All project management responsibilities and cost sharing for the respective entities are identified in the attached LFA. This LFA will also provide for MDX to construct the balance of the 92404 Interchange on FTE right-of-way.

This LFA will facilitate the construction of MDX Project 92404, SR 924 West Extension to the HEFT. This Project will provide ramp connections between the HEFT and NW 138<sup>th</sup> Street. This Project will also improve access to the major expressways in the area and provide more reliable travel times during congestion periods. The Project will also meet the east/west mobility needs for commuter and freight traffic by providing immediate relief from traffic congestion in the area.

Mr. Toledo entertained questions from members. A revised LFA was distributed at the meeting. The change in the revised LFA was the reduction of the estimated construction cost from \$5,792,000.00 to a lower amount of \$5,220,000.00.

Mr. Meyer moved to endorse the LFA with the Florida's Turnpike Enterprise. Mr. Boord seconded the motion. The motion was unanimously endorsed.

- D) MDX Procurement/Contract No. MDX-19-02 MDX Purchase of LED Roadway Lighting Luminaires (Not to Exceed \$600,000)
- Endorsement of Purchase Order for LED Roadway Lighting Luminaires

Over the last several years MDX has been reviewing options for converting the MDX roadway lighting systems from High Pressure Sodium (HPS) to Light-Emitting Diode (LED) illumination.

For the portion of the MDX System that is not currently under construction nor scheduled for construction in the near future, it was determined that the most efficient way of procuring the conversion of the roadway lighting system is to purchase the Lumca Ovaali LED luminaires directly from the manufacturer/distributor Sesco Lighting, which is the sole source provider for this product.

Mr. Toledo informed members that Florida Drawbridge, MDX's current asset maintenance contractor, would do the installation. Ms. Gutiérrez moved to approve the procurement. Mr. Meyer seconded the motion. The motion was unanimously approved.

# MOTION TO APPROVE THE EXTENSION OF THE LEASE TO THE SCHOOL BOARD OF MIAMI-DADE COUNTY FOR PARCEL 878-500-C

## **REQUESTED ACTION:**

• MOTION TO APPROVE: for no consideration, a five (5) year lease extension, with one additional five (5) year renewal option, with the School Board of Miami-Dade County ("School Board") for Parcel 878-500-C.

### **SUMMARY EXPLANATION AND BACKGROUND:**

The parent tract of Parcel 878-500 lies under the SR 878 Bridge at SW 80<sup>th</sup> Street and SW 72<sup>nd</sup> Avenue and is divided into three sections. Parcel 878-500-C is one of the three divided sections being leased. The School Board uses this parcel for school bus ingress and egress from SW 80<sup>th</sup> Street, for the staging of MDCPS buses, and for loading and unloading students riding the Metrorail.

The original lease agreement was approved by the Board on September 22, 2009 for no consideration and was extended on February 28, 2014. The current term will expire June 30, 2019. The School Board has requested a five (5) year extension with one additional five (5) year renewal option under the same terms and conditions of the current lease.

### MANNER IN WHICH REQUESTED ACTION ADVANCES MDX STRATEGIC GOALS:

The School Board has been using the parcel for some time. The leasing of Parcel 878-500-C to the School Board, for no consideration, would allow for the continuation of the use of the parcel by the School Board for school bus ingress and egress from SW 80th Street and for loading and unloading students.

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

#### **SUMMARY EXPLANATION AND BACKGROUND:**

Staff is requesting to lease Parcel(s) 11205-158, which is located at 3972 NW 36<sup>th</sup> Street, and Parcel 11205-159, which is located at 3906 NW 36<sup>th</sup> Street, both situated just east of Le Jeune Road. Both parcels measure approximately 11,857 and 62,770 square feet and have recorded access easements owned by the South Florida Water Management District. Each parcel is fenced and was previously utilized as a staging area for various capital projects.

The parcels were purchased as part of the MDX Project #11205 Interconnector to SR 112, which is not currently funded for construction. On December 5, 2018, the Board approved advertising for competitive bid. As required in the MDX Excess Property Leasing Policy, a market appraisal was completed that estimated the Property's current annual rental value as \$131,200. On December 10, 2018, the Property was advertised for competitive bidding. Although six parties had expressed interest and requested bid packages, only one sealed bid was received. The bid was for \$135,600 per year from RER Kalvest Investment LLC located at 2020 Ponce De Leon Blvd. Suite 1106 Coral Gables, FL 33134 to operate a storage facility. The required 10% security deposit has been received.

The lease term will be for three (3) years with one (1) year renewal options. In addition, the lease annual rental rate be adjusted annually based on the Revised Consumer Price Index U.S. City Average for All Urban Consumers All Items, ("CPI").

### MANNER IN WHICH REQUESTED ACTION ADVANCES MDX STRATEGIC GOALS:



## **SUMMARY EXPLANATION AND BACKGROUND:**

On November 20, 2018, MDX released an Invitation to Bid (ITB) seeking bids from qualified contractors to provide construction services for the reconstruction of NW 82<sup>nd</sup> Avenue, the Midway Pump Station Conveyance, and NW 7<sup>th</sup> Street connection (the "Project"). On December 5, 2018, MDX held a Mandatory Pre-Bid meeting to go over the requirements of the ITB, including the Prerequisite Criteria. Post the Pre-Bid meeting, several Addenda were released, amongst other things, responding to Bidders' questions.

Bidders were required to separate their Bid Packages in two (2) separate sealed parts and submit concurrently. The ITB required that Part 1 contain the Prerequisite Documentation and Part 2 contain the bid price, which together make up the Bid Package. This two-step process allows MDX to only consider Bids from Proposers that are compliant and meet the minimum requirements of qualification.

On January 8, 2019, eleven (11) Bid Packages were received in response to the ITB from the following Bidders:

- 1. American Pipeline Construction, LLC
- 2. Community Asphalt Corp.
- 3. Condotte America Inc.
- 4. Florida Engineering and Development Corp.
- 5. Halley Engineering Contractors, Inc.
- 6. H & R Paving, Inc.

As outlined on the ITB, Part 1 of the Bid Packages were opened after the established deadline and a review was performed to determine compliance with the ITB and Prerequisites.

## Compliance/Responsiveness Review:

Bidders were required to demonstrate compliance with the Prerequisite Criteria by having a member of the team (whether the prime contractor or its subcontractors) prequalified/licensed by the State and/or the County for various types of work.

The following five (5) Bidders did not properly meet the Prerequisite Criteria:

- American Pipeline Construction, LLC ("American")
- Condotte America, Inc. ("Condotte")
- Florida Engineering and Development Corp. ("Florida")
- Halley Engineering Contractors, Inc. ("Halley")
- V Engineering & Consulting Corp. ("V Engineering")

The Teaming Restriction in the ITB limited a Bidder (prime contractor) to participate in only one Bid Package, whether as a prime or as a subcontractor. Violation of this restriction rendered non-Responsive all Bid Packages in which the Bidder participated. American & Florida met one of the Prerequisites by using Halley, whom is also a Bidder as a Prime. Violation of this restriction rendered all three (3) teams non-Responsive.

Condotte and V Engineering were each missing a Prerequisite, Traffic Signal; and Hot Plant Mixed Bituminous, respectively.

Based on the information provided herein, Staff recommends that the five Bidders listed above be deemed non-Responsive and therefore their Bids (Part 2 of the Bid Package) will not be opened.

Part 2 of the Bid Packages have not been opened pending action by the Committee on Staff's recommendation concerning non-responsiveness. Should the Committee accept Staff's recommendation, Part 2 of the qualified six (6) Bid Packages will be opened at the Committee meeting to determine the lowest Bidder.

The Contract includes a 15% Small Business participation requirement, as well as a 15% Local Business participation requirement.

## MANNER IN WHICH REQUESTED ACTION ADVANCES MDX STRATEGIC GOALS:

This Project will complete the connection of NW 82<sup>nd</sup> Avenue and NW 7<sup>th</sup> Street anticipated by the construction of the FDOT Section 5 Project, which constructed bridges on SR 836 and SR 826 to facilitate the ultimate connections of the roadway network.

### **FISCAL IMPACT:**

This project is funded in the MDX FY 2019-2013 Five Year Work Program for the work associated with NW 82<sup>nd</sup> Avenue, and by Miami Dade County for the work associated with NW 7<sup>th</sup> Street.

• Advertisement of an Invitation to Negotiate (ITN) for Transportation Services.

## **SUMMARY EXPLANATION AND BACKGROUND:**

In the summer of 2017, the Miami-Dade Transportation Planning Organization (TPO) requested that MDX provide an express transportation service option along State Road (SR) 836 in coordination with their SMART Plan - East/West Corridor. Innovative transportation alternatives and the creation and use of Express Technology (XT) Lanes along SR 836 had been identified as a priority in MDX's Strategic Plan. Therefore, MDX agreed to provide an alternative service for motorists in an effort to reduce congestion during peak periods in the peak direction. The timing of this anticipated service will coincide with the completion of the ongoing SR 836 widening projects.

The service is expected to accommodate flexibility in schedule and headways to respond to demand. The service will be anchored at the west end at the Dolphin Park and Ride Station (Dolphin Station) located on the north side of NW 12<sup>th</sup> Street at NW 121<sup>st</sup> Avenue. Initially, the service will travel between Dolphin Station and a location in Downtown Miami near the Overtown Transit Village. This route was chosen for this pilot project based on the TPO's request, availability of XT Lanes, and anticipated customer interest. MDX will explore additional routes along SR 836 to and from the Dolphin Station, and potentially other MDX facilities, as ridership information and preferences are gathered and analyzed. The service will utilize the soon to be completed inside shoulder Express Technology Lane (XT Lane) when warranted by congestion levels.

During the initial service trial period, information/data obtained is intended to establish long term demand, customer preferences, service parameters, routing, hours of operation, etc. Additionally, data gathered will be utilized to formulate future MDX service offerings with potentially wider variety of routes on multiple MDX facilities and additional destinations.

### **SMALL AND LOCAL BUSINESS PARTICIPATION:**

Staff recommends that a requirement for Small Business (SB) Participation and MDX certified Local Businesses (LB) not be included in this contract. A search of Miami-Dade County's Small Business Enterprise database revealed only 8 potential certified transportation providers. These firms appear to be focused on either motor coach charters or non-emergency medical transport. Responders to this ITN for the pilot project services are expected to offer an innovative, turn key solution that will be unique in our marketplace with limited subcontracting opportunities. Staff recommends that opportunities for participation be explored with the selected vendor during contract negotiations.

## MANNER IN WHICH REQUESTED ACTION ADVANCES MDX STRATEGIC GOALS:

Innovative transportation alternative and the creation and use of Express Technology (XT) Lanes along our most congested facilities was identified as a priority in MDX's Strategic Plan. This service will serve to improve mobility, decrease congestion, offer commuting options and further MDX's mission to serve the mobility needs of the community and improve the economic climate in Miami-Dade County.

### **FISCAL IMPACT:**

MDX has an available budget of \$1,050,000 in Fiscal Year 2019 for this service. It is anticipated that a similar amount will be budgeted in future fiscal years for this service.

**MDX Express Transportation Service** 

ITN -19-01

#### **General Description**

MDX seeks to provide an Express Transportation Service (XTS) along SR 836. The service will run during peak hours in the peak direction. The service is to be planned to accommodate flexibility in schedule and headways to respond to demand. The MDX XTS will be anchored at the west end by MDX's Dolphin Park and Ride Station (Dolphin Station) located on the north side of NW 12<sup>th</sup> Street at NW 121<sup>st</sup> Avenue. Initially, the service will travel between there and a location in Downtown Miami near the Overtown Transit Village with no intermediate stops. MDX will explore additional routes along SR 836 to and from the Dolphin Station, and potentially other MDX facilities, as ridership information and preferences are gathered. The MDX XTS will run along the available inside shoulder Express Technology Lane (XT Lane) when warranted by congestion levels.

The XTS service covered by this procurement is intended as a pilot project to establish long term demand, customer preferences, service parameters, routing, etc. as part of an initial data gathering and service trial period. Emphasis is being placed on flexibility, data gathering, data analytics, and the customer experience. The services covered under this solicitation will be reservation based and is expected to be free to the customer. The service will be accessed by the customer through an MDX XTS interface developed as part of the services under this procurement. The selected provider will be required to assist MDX in marketing the service to potential customers.

The Dolphin Station will be available to house the vehicles associated with the service overnight.

The XTS service must be deployed within 90 days of Notice to Proceed from MDX.

#### Term

The service will be provided for a two (2) year period. There will be three (3) additional one (1) year renewal periods that can be executed at MDX's sole discretion.

#### **Budget**

MDX has an available budget of \$1,050,000 in Fiscal Year 2019 for this service. It is anticipated that a similar amount will be budgeted in future fiscal years for this service.

#### Minimum Requirements

#### Vehicle

- Driver shall be appropriately licensed.
- Vehicles need a boarding device (e.g. lift or ramp) so that a passenger who uses a
  wheelchair or mobility device can reach a securement location onboard. Lifts must have a
  minimum design load of 600 pounds and lift platforms must accommodate a wheelchair
  measuring 30 inches by 48 inches.
- Vehicles shall accommodate a minimum of 10 passengers and a maximum of 28 passengers not including the driver.
- Vehicle shall measure less than 30 feet in length.
- Vehicles must be able to be legally driven on limited access facilities.
- Vehicles must be able to travel at a minimum of 50 mph.
- Vehicles must be fully enclosed and temperature controlled.
- Vehicles must be dedicated exclusively to MDX and must be wrapped and/or painted to MDX's XTS branding standards.

#### **Customer Interface**

- Primarily available via smart phone based application.
- Available via additional methods (e.g. phone, physical kiosk, etc.) to accommodate customers without internet and/or smart phones.
- Shall be reservation based and accommodate cancellations, no shows, and stand by passengers.
- Shall be based on establishing the customer as a registered customer with the ability to gather information on preferences, additional service requests, polling, and other customer data as may be appropriate.

## **Service Parameters**

- Core service hours are 6:30 AM to 9:30 AM and 3:30 PM to 6:30 PM
- Maximum 20 minute headways during core service hours

#### **Response Contents**

- Describe your proposed service parameters.
- Describe your proposed vehicles and relevant features.
- Describe your proposed in-vehicle customer amenities.
- Describe any environmentally friendly features of your vehicles.
- Describe your proposed customer interface and relevant features.
- Describe any additional customer amenities and features not related to the in-vehicle experience.
- Describe revenue generating options of your service (not related to customer fares).
- Describe your proposed marketing strategy/campaign for the service.
- Describe your proposed customer data gathering/analytics and reporting ability, methodology and techniques.

- Describe your schedule to develop and deploy the vehicles and customer interface.
- Describe your ability to modify and enhance the service, including the service frequency, routes, customer interface and data gathering/analytics/reporting features, to accommodate customer and MDX preferences.
- Describe your previous experience providing this or similar types of service including vehicles proposed, service parameters, customer interface, etc.

#### **Evaluation Criteria**

#### **Service Parameters**

The responder will be evaluated based on their proposed operating plan. Service parameters including headways and frequency during core and outside of core hours will be reviewed. The responder's ability to respond to service changes and/or enhancements requested by MDX in response to customer needs will be reviewed as well.

#### **Vehicle Features**

- The responder's proposed vehicles, including average age, will be evaluated. The number of passengers accommodated per vehicle and seating configurations will be evaluated. Additional proposed in vehicle amenities will be evaluated as well. Consideration will be given to a responder's use of environmentally friendly vehicle platforms.

#### **Customer Interface**

- The responder's proposed customer interface will be evaluated. The interface's ease of use, functionality and features will be evaluated. The secondary customer interface for non-smart phone customers will be evaluated as well. The responder's ability to update and enhance the customer interface over time in response to MDX and customer needs will be considered.

#### Marketing Campaign

- The responder's proposed marketing strategies for the service will be evaluated as they relate to promoting ridership and the service's benefits. The approach and specific tactics that will be utilized to promote the service will be considered.

### **Data Gathering and Analytics**

- The responder's approach to gathering, maintaining, and utilizing customer and service data will be evaluated. Consideration will be given to data gathering techniques and the ability to poll customers on usage patterns, service preferences, etc. Data analytics and reporting on trends will be evaluated as well.

### **Deployment Schedule**

The responder's approach to developing and deploying the service will be evaluated. Consideration will be given to the robustness of the deployment plan and its ability to meet or beat MDX's maximum deployment timeline. Method of procuring vehicles and developing and implementing the customer interface will be considered as well.

#### **Other Considerations**

- The responder's approach to handling customer service interactions and issue resolution will be evaluated.
- The responder's approach to providing amenities, features and convenience options to customers in addition to in-vehicle amenities will be considered.



#### **Transportation Improvement Program**

#### Project #11212 - SR 112/NW 37th Avenue Interchange

The project has been deferred indefinitely. ROW activities for the Parcel Swap are underway however. The Property Owners have agreed to pay for an additional appraisal, as they did not agree with MDX's original appraisal amounts. A meeting between MDX and the parcel owners will be scheduled once the additional appraisals are ordered and received.

### Project #83611 – SR 836 – Interchange Improvements at I-95

Notice to proceed was issued on July 18, 2018 to Archer Western-De Moya Joint Venture. The contract duration is 4 years and the project limits start at approximately NW 17<sup>th</sup> Avenue on SR 836 and continue through the SR 836/I-395/I-95 (Midtown) Interchange along I-395 to the MacArthur Causeway Bridge. The limits on I-95 are from NW 8<sup>th</sup> Street to NW 29<sup>th</sup> Street. Survey and geotechnical work began in January. Construction for foundations will commence in April 2019.

# Project #83618 – SR 836 Southwest Extension (Kendall Parkway)

The preferred alternative has been selected. Roadway design is almost final. Drafts for the Project Environmental Impact Report (PIER) and the Preliminary Engineering Report (PER) were completed and released for public display in November 2018. Documents supporting information summarized in the PEIR and PER for the different disciplines were also completed at the end of November. MDX-GEC reviewed and submitted comments on draft environmental documents such as the Endangered Species Biological Assessment (ESBA) Report and the Wetlands Evaluation Report (WER). Also, draft reports for other disciplines such as the Drainage Report and Bridge Analysis Report were reviewed by

MDX-GEC. Portions of the information for the Traffic Analysis for Phase II have been reviewed by MDX-GEC, such as: a) DRAFT results for the existing conditions intersections/arterial and freeway analysis (AM and PM) b) 2050 Projected Peak Hour Volumes and c) Draft 2050 No-Build intersections/arterial and freeway analysis. Coordination with MDC RER in support of the project's CDMP amendment filing is still on-going. Public Hearing for the PD&E project took place on December 13th, 2018. Comments from the public hearing have been summarized and the draft for the public recorder's transcript has been distributed for review. Documents will be updated accordingly once information from the Public Hearing has been finalized. The master plan for the project continues to be developed for submittal and approval pursuant to the Interlocal Agreement with Miami-Dade County. Additionally, Environmental Permit package preparation is on-going.

# Project #83628 – SR 836 Operational, Capacity and Interchange Improvements

The Contractor, Odebrecht Construction Inc. (OCI) continues to work under Phase I of the Traffic Control Plan (TCP) which consists of the construction of an additional lane in both westbound and eastbound directions. They are also working under Phase II of the TCP for the reconstruction of the median barrier wall between NW 57<sup>th</sup> Ave and NW 34<sup>th</sup> Ave. This work includes full depth reconstruction of the inside shoulders in both eastbound and westbound directions on SR 836 from NW 57<sup>th</sup> Ave to NW 17<sup>th</sup> Ave. This work is necessary to accommodate Express Buses from the Dolphin Station Park and Ride to MIA and downtown.

#### NW 57<sup>th</sup> Ave Interchange to NW 45<sup>th</sup> Ave Ramps:

At the NW 57<sup>th</sup> Ave interchange, OCI has completed Phase II of the Diverging Diamond Interchange (DDI) and the construction of the protective concrete barrier wall for the pedestrian crossing through the DDI. OCI has

completed the reconstruction of the widening of the mainline west of the 57<sup>th</sup> Ave toll gantry and has shifted this area to the Phase II median work.

## NW 45<sup>th</sup> Ave Ramps to NW 42<sup>nd</sup> Ave (Le Jeune Rd) Interchange:

The EB SR 836 Collector Distributor (CD) has been opened to traffic including the new movement from eastbound SR 836 to northbound/southbound Le Jeune Rd/MIA. OCI has demolished the existing bridges and foundations for the mainline inside lanes and continues hauling the demolition debris away in order to begin construction of the foundation of the new median barrier wall.

### NW $42^{\underline{\text{nd}}}$ Ave (Le Jeune Rd) Interchange to $34^{\underline{\text{m}}}$ Ave Ramps ( $14^{\underline{\text{m}}}$ St):

From NW 42<sup>nd</sup> Ave to NW 34<sup>th</sup> Ave EB, roadway construction operations continue on the eastbound inside lanes including the inside widening of the bridge over Lejeune Rd. Westbound from NW 34<sup>th</sup> Ave, OCI has shifted the mainline into phase II of the traffic control plans opening the work area for the reconstruction of the median barrier wall. This traffic shift also included the construction of the NW 37<sup>th</sup> Ave off ramp to NW 14<sup>th</sup> Street connecting westbound to Le Jeune Road. The new on ramp from NW 37<sup>th</sup> avenue to SR 836EB has been completed and opened to traffic. Construction is ongoing on NW 14<sup>th</sup> street and the ramp from to NB Le Jeune Rd/MIA. This ramp is scheduled to be opened to traffic by the beginning of March 2019.

#### 34<sup>th</sup> Ave to 17<sup>th</sup> Ave Interchange:

In the eastbound direction, OCI continues working on the widening of the new outside lane approaching the NW 27<sup>th</sup> Avenue interchange. The new bridge over westbound NW 29<sup>th</sup> avenue has been completed and opened to traffic and the contractor is now working on the final roadway tie in to the new off ramp to NW 27<sup>th</sup> Ave. OCI continues with

earthwork grading operations on all four quadrants of the NW 27<sup>th</sup> Ave interchange, as well as the construction of the westbound on and off ramps to NW 27<sup>th</sup> Ave in order to complete this interchange.

From NW 17<sup>th</sup> Ave to NW 27<sup>th</sup> Ave westbound, OCI completed the bridge for the 17<sup>th</sup> Ave northbound on ramp to westbound SR 836. OCI continues working on the construction of the bridge of the SB NW 17<sup>th</sup> Ave on ramp to westbound SR 836. This ramp is scheduled to be completed by the mid-April 2019.

### Project #83629 – SR 836 – Interchange Modifications at 87<sup>th</sup> Ave

The Contractor, Odebrecht Construction, Inc. (OCI) continues to work under the Traffic Control Plans Phase 1A condition in the expressway area. After completion of the Phase 2 portion of the decks for the two mainline bridges, the Contractor has moved to forming and pouring their corresponding approach slabs. OCI is also installing the stay-in-place formwork for the new bridge from WB SR 836 towards SB NW 87th Avenue. The Contractor continues to work on Eastbound roadway activities, as the mainline and ramps approach the project limits at NW 82<sup>nd</sup> Avenue. Embankment and roadway base activities are underway, and paving should follow shortly. OCI has installed the temporary barrier wall to allow complete access to the new Toll Gantry roadway area at the EB onramp from NW 87th Avenue. The gantry structure has passed the coating inspection and is expected within the next couple of weeks. The permanent power infrastructure has been completed and is awaiting connection from FP&L to allow the new equipment shelter to be functional.

At NW 12<sup>th</sup> St, OCI has now moved completely to Phase 2 of the Traffic Control Plan. The Contractor partially installed the Mechanically Stabilized Wall at the median of NW 12<sup>th</sup> Street, in order to allow the construction of the

eastern end bent for the new flyover bridge over NW 84<sup>th</sup> Avenue. The installation of the tub girders for this new ramp from NW 12<sup>th</sup> Street to WB SR 836 is anticipated for the latter part of March 2019. The Contractor continues with the roadway reconstruction of the median area, including the installation of the new curb and gutter. Shortly after the tub girders are installed for the new ramp bridge at NW 12<sup>th</sup> Street, OCI intends to complete the new triple left movement from WB NW 12<sup>th</sup> Street to SB NW 87<sup>th</sup> Avenue. This will allow the temporary closure of the existing WB SR 836 to SB NW 87<sup>th</sup> Avenue ramp. OCI continues to work on the lighting, ITS and signalization throughout the Project. Some of the CCTV cameras and other devices are already being transferred to their permanent locations.

OCI has submitted a Time Extension Request for 174 days of delay. MDX has issued Unilateral Payment #1 for the direct costs and 31 excusable days associated with one of the four time impacts mentioned by OCI. MDX continues to evaluate the other three delays claimed by OCI and will issue additional Unilateral Payments, if necessary.

The last Contractor invoice (January 2019), under review, reflects a project milestone of 77.10% of work in place and 97.04% of the allowable contract time used.

#### Project #83634 – SR 836 Ramp Connections to HEFT

The Design-Build solicitation documents are being updated to reflect the most up to date information available. The project's Design-Build advertisement is expected in early 2019.

## Project #87410 – SR 874 Ramp Connector FTE Bridges:

Bridge Substructure: Approximately 96% of the piles have been installed; 18 out of 20 foundations have been completed and two are under construction. A total of 18 out of 20 columns have been built. Also, 16 pier caps have

been built out of 18. The overall construction of the substructure is approximately 95.5 % complete. Substructure work continues on Piers 12-8 and 12-9 foundations.

Bridge Superstructure: Pre-stressed beams have been installed on 6 spans of bridge 12 and 8 spans (all spans) of bridge 13. Bridge decks 12-1, 12-2, 12-3, 12-4, and all 8 decks corresponding to Bridge 13 have been poured. Overall superstructure construction is estimated at 51% complete. No work has been performed on these bridges during the past month.

#### MDX Project:

Work on Segment 1 continued on Phase 1 from 127th to 122<sup>nd</sup> Avenue, with drainage installation and roadway reconstruction. Traffic was switched to Phase 2 from 137th Avenue to 127th Avenue. From 127th to 122nd on Segment 1, the Contractor began drainage installation and continues with water lines installation. Construction activities are also in progress on Segment 2, water and sewer work and drainage installation continued. Bridge construction on Segment 2 was concluded for Phase 1, the Contractor began work on Phase 1A. A total of six foundations, columns and connecting pier caps are completed. Additionally, on this segment, cure work at Miami Vineyard Church is in progress; the existing canopy was removed, roof and fascia restoration concluded and parking lot drainage work began and is in progress. On Segment 3, the Contractor continued working on bridge 13 foundations and columns, MSE wall copings and roadway widening on southbound SR 874.

## Project #87413 – SR 874 Interchange at SW 72<sup>nd</sup> Street (Sunset Drive)

The draft Interchange Traffic Report was reviewed, commented on, and is being resolved with FDOT. A revised Interchange Traffic Report that addresses all comments will be resubmitted to FDOT for concurrence. The project's Informational Meeting and Public Hearing will

be scheduled in calendar year 2019 after FDOT has provided concurrence on the Interchange Traffic Report operational analysis for SW 72<sup>nd</sup> Street.

Project #92404 - SR 924 Extension West to the HEFT

Final design plans for work to be completed by Florida's Turnpike has been developed and submitted. Design specifications are being finalized. The re-evaluation document is being coordinated with FDOT for approval.

#### Project #92407 – SR 924 Extension East to I-95

Final engineering and environmental reports were submitted to FDOT. Comment resolution meeting to resolve outstanding comments on final reports was held. Project public outreach efforts along the corridor and with pertinent stakeholders have been concluded. Continuing project activities have been placed on hold.

Project #92408 – SR 924/NW 67<sup>th</sup> Avenue Interchange The project's PD&E was put on hold in June 2018. The study will resume in March 2019.

#### Project 10017 – SR 836 Toll System Conversion

Coordination is on-going with the Civil Contractors for the civil infrastructure needed for the new toll zones within Projects 83628 and 83629. All new toll zones installed under Project 83628 are in revenue collection. Negotiations with the Civil Contractor and TransCore for modifications to the existing toll zones at NW 57th Ave and NW 17th Ave are on-going. A TA was issued on Jan. 15, 2019 to TransCore for this work.

#### Project #10021 - System-wide ITS Improvements

This Project has been combined with MDX Project 30034 – SR 924 Milling and Resurfacing from SR 826 to MM 1.2 and with Project 40044 – SR 924 Drainage Improvements at NW 32<sup>nd</sup> Ave to install the Speed Feedback Signs. The Contractor's Notice to Proceed was issued on April 16, 2018. All the signs were completed and tested during the month of December 2018. Final acceptance was issued

as of December 29, 2018. Working on final estimates and project close-out documents.

#### **Capital Improvement Program**

## Project #40041, 40042 & 40043 ORT System Replacement on SR 924, SR 878 & SR 874

All toll zones on SR 874 and SR 924 have gone live. A walkthrough to identify punch list items has been completed. TransCore is working on correcting identified items and on the delivery of As-Built plans.

### Project #40044 – SR 924 Drainage Improvements at NW 32<sup>nd</sup> Ave.

The Contractor's Notice to Proceed was issued on April 16, 2018. The Construction duration is 240 Days. The pond area was graded and sodded this period. Halley Engineering Contractors Inc. (HEC) completed all pending activities east of the SFRTA railroad tracks and the slope restoration. The Contractor's Final Acceptance was issued as of December 29, 2018. Working on final estimates and project close-out documents.

#### Project #50001 – Dolphin Station Park & Ride

MDX and the Contractor have completed testing and training of various components (Lighting, Parking Management, Surveillance and Generator). Only pending item is the BTIS. In addition, as-builts and warranty packages have been reviewed. Furthermore, MDC has confirmed "acceptance of transfer" of FP&L services/billing for both signalization and lighting along NW 12th Street. The Facility is still pending official transfer to MDX.

# Project #30029 – System-wide Bridge Rehabilitation and Joint repairs

Final set of Plans and Bid Package sent to Engineering in December 2018.

## Project #30033 – Systemwide Pavement Markings Rehabilitation (Phase II)

MDX has decided to have the new MDX Wet Weather Pavement Markings installed in high priority areas of the system via a work order with FDI. The first scheduled location is SR 924.

### Project #30034 – SR 924 Milling and Resurfacing from SR 826 to MM 1.2.

This project was procured jointly with MDX Project #40044 – SR 924 Drainage Improvements at NW 32nd Avenue and MDX Project #10021 – SR 924 Speed Feedback Signs. The Notice to Proceed was issued April 16, 2018 with a Construction duration of 240 Days. All paving operations were completed at the end of November 2018, including all the deficiencies found with the laser profiling test. The Contractor's Final Acceptance was issued as of December 29, 2018. Working on final estimates and project close-out documents.

### Project #30037 – Systemwide Class V Coating (Phase I)

MDX has decided to combine this project with Project # 30043. The combined scope is currently being prepared, at which time Final Design will begin.

#### Project #30041 - SR 878 LED Roadway Lighting

The lighting upgrade recommendation memorandum has been submitted and reviewed. Memorandum is to be updated to shift the lighting to the median.

## Project #30042 – SR 836 Replacement of High-Mast Lights with LED

The lighting upgrade recommendation memorandum has been submitted and was presented to MDX. Final Design is complete, and the Bid Package is being prepared.

## Project #30043 – Systemwide ORT Gantries & Signature Structures Painting

MDX has decided to combine this project with Project # 30037. The combined scope is currently being prepared, at which time Final Design will begin.

### Project #30056 - Systemwide Infrastructure Modifications at Tolling Points

The Contractor has completed all scope included in the modifications of the tolling civil infrastructure on SR 874, SR 878 and SR 924. Final Acceptance was given on January 9, 2019. Project final payment will follow after the closeout process.
