ACTION ITEMS

A) Approval of Summary Minutes:

Operations, External Communications and Inter-Governmental Committee Meeting of February 26, 2019. Mr. Rodriguez informed Members of modifications to the Summary Minutes on page 2 Item B – adding that the amount of the annual rental value of the parcel would be approximately \$50,000.

Ms. Gutierrez moved to approve the Summary Minutes for the February 26, 2019 meeting as amended. Mr. Wolfe seconded the motion. The motion was unanimously approved as amended.

- B) MDX Procurement/Contract Number ITB-19-02; MDX Work Program No. 83629.060; Construction Services for NW 82nd Ave. Reconstruction, Midway Pump Station Conveyance Phase II and NW 7th Street Connection (Project Estimate \$4,560,000)
 - Approval to Reject all Bids and Re-Advertise

Mr. Toledo introduced the item and informed Members that on January 8, 2019 (the submittal deadline), eleven (11) bid packages were submitted. However, post 1/8/19, it was brought to MDX's attention that the Traffic Control Plans and associated quantities on the Midway Pump Station Conveyance Phase II and NW 7th Street Connection projects, requires the contractor to prepare a Maintenance of Traffic (MOT) plan, which also requires the County's review and approval. After reviewing the existing bid documents, it became apparent that the current documents create a potential uncertainty for the bidders regarding the development and pricing of the MOT and associated quantities for the Pump Station. Furthermore, if the documents were not revised, the situation would create an inherent project delay for the development and review of the MOT plans. The uncertainty could lead to increased pricing and safety issues; and the development and the approval of the Traffic Control Plan could also create a delay in the Project construction.

As a risk mitigation measure and in an effort to reduce uncertainty and costs, Staff recommends preparing a revised bid package to offer additional clarity on the Traffic Control Plans and associated quantities for the Pump Station and re-bidding the project. The submitted bids were never opened and are currently exempt from Public Records, if the Project is rebid.

Ms. Gutierrez moved to reject all bids and re-advertise the project with revised bid documents. Mr. Wolfe seconded the motion. The motion was unanimously approved.

Mr. Toledo recommended that the Committee consider Agenda items IV. C and IV E together.

- C) MDX Work Program No. 83611 SR 836/I-95 Interchange Improvements
 - Endorsement of an Interlocal Agreement (ILA) with Miami-Dade County to Facilitate the Construction of the 83611 Project and for MDX to construct a Temporary Parking Lot.

Mr. Toledo explained that the purpose of facilitating the Project improvements and for providing a staging area for the Design-Build construction. MDX has negotiated with the County to acquire Permanent Easements (PE) and Temporary Construction Easements (TCE) for parcels owned by Miami-Dade County that are in proximity to the Project. A map was distributed at the meeting. These parcels are currently being used by the County's Department of Corrections and Rehabilitation for parking. As part of the Project, the Design-Build Team will provide a Replacement Parking Lot, immediately to the west of the Corrections facility. There will also be some permanent and short term impacts to the Department's employee parking lot, *see* Exhibit No. 2. The Replacement Parking Lot will be used by the Department for employee parking during construction activities. The ILA also includes various construction requirements and work restrictions necessary to facilitate construction activities adjacent to the Department's facility.

Ms. Gutierrez moved to endorse the Interlocal Agreement with Miami-Dade County. Mr. Wolfe seconded the motion. The motion was unanimously endorsed

E) Approval of lease to Miami-Dade County for MDX Parcel 836-600

The Leased Parcel lies under the SR 836 bridge at NW 7th Avenue and is used by the County's Corrections Department to park its employees' vehicles and to secure access into the facility.

This is a ten (10) year lease with County's Department of Corrections for Parcel 836-600. It's a rent-free, government lease with an Extended Lease option for an additional ten (10) years, at MDX's sole discretion. The annual rental value of the property would be approximately \$120,000.

Ms. Gutierrez moved to endorse the lease with Miami-Dade County. Mr. Wolfe seconded the motion. The motion was unanimously endorsed

- D) MDX Procurement/Contract Number RFP-19-01; MDX Work Program No. 92404.030 Design-Build Services for 107th Avenue
- Approval to Advertise
- Advertisement of a Request for Proposal (RFP) procurement process for the selection of a qualified Design-Build Firm.
- Technical Evaluation Committee composition
- Proposal Evaluation Criteria

Mr. Toledo introduced the item and informed Members that staff is requesting Committee approval to advertise a Request for Proposals (RFP) for the selection of a qualified Design-Build Firm to provide design and construction services for the NW 107th Avenue Improvements project from NW 138th Street to NW 166th Street.

Pursuant to an Interlocal Agreement and subsequent amendment, MDX partnered with Miami-Dade County, the City of Hialeah, and the City of Hialeah Gardens to develop, design and construct NW 107th Avenue between NW 138th Street and NW 170th Street. MDX will procure and manage the construction the Project. Miami-Dade County, the City of Hialeah, and the City of Hialeah Gardens are solely responsible for obtaining the right-of-way needed to construct the Project; and Miami-Dade County is solely responsible for the costs and expenses to develop, design and construct the Project.

Upon completion of the Project, Miami-Dade County will own, operate and maintain NW 107th Avenue.

Mr. Wolfe volunteered to be the MDX Board Member on Technical Evaluation Committee.

The advertisement for the Project services will occur after Miami-Dade County, the City of Hialeah, and the City of Hialeah Gardens have secured right-of-way and funding necessary to construct the Project.

Miami-Dade County is solely responsible for the costs and expenses associated with the Project's development, design, construction and long-term maintenance of the NW 107th Avenue roadway and canal components of the Project. Additionally, the City of Hialeah will be solely responsible for the costs and expenses associated with the Project's development, design, construction and long-term maintenance of the water and sewer infrastructure component of the Project.

Mr. Wolfe moved to approve the advertisement, Technical Evaluation Committee composition and the evaluation criteria. Ms. Gutierrez seconded the motion. The motion was unanimously approved.

E) Approval of Interlocal Agreement/Transportation Grant Funding between Florida International University and Miami-Dade Expressway Authority

Mr. Toledo informed Members that recently FIU approached MDX to explore traffic congestion management strategies. FIU has initiated a program that provides parking incentives to students who carpool to FIU campuses. FIU approached MDX to explore enhancing its Pilot Program by also providing incentives for students who carpool to its campuses. Accordingly, MDX will reimburse FIU for payments it makes to qualified Program participants who paid MDX tolls via SunPass® in accordance with the Program's requirements. MDX and FIU will use the data obtained during the Pilot Period to evaluate the effectiveness of this Program for reducing highway congestion on MDX roadways and within Miami-Dade County. MDX's financial participation in this Pilot Project will not exceed \$10,000.00.

Mr. Wolfe informed Committee Members that FIU also reached out to FDOT- District 6 for the Pilot Program.

Mr. Toledo entertained questions from Members.

Mr. Wolfe moved to approve the Interlocal Agreement with FIU. Ms. Gutierrez seconded the motion. The motion was unanimously approved

FISCAL YEAR 2020 ANNUAL BUDGET AND FUNDING REQUIREMENTS

REQUESTED ACTION:

MOTION TO ENDORSE:

• Fiscal Year 2020 Annual Budget and Funding Requirements

SUMMARY EXPLANATION AND BACKGROUND:

The FY 2020 Budget outlines all forecasted revenues of \$239.7 million and expenditures of \$360.8 million. The expenditures are for the period of July 1, 2019 through June 30, 2020, which provides for: (a) \$52.8 million of annual operations, maintenance and administration (including \$2.5 million for Park & Ride Operations); (b) \$106.6 million for debt service payments (principal and interest); (c) \$920,000 for capital non-work program expenditures; and (d) \$200.5 million of work program capital projects.

The source of funding for the Fiscal Year 2020 Work Program expenditures include available funds in the Renewal & Replacement (R&R) Fund of \$31.1 million; FY 2020 flow of funds of \$79.4 million, and \$90.0 million from the General Reserves.

MANNER IN WHICH REQUESTED ACTION ADVANCES MDX STRATEGIC GOALS:

Endorsement of the FY 20 Budget complies with Florida Statutes, the Trust Indenture, and MDX Policies. The purpose of the FY 20 Budget is to predict the financial position of the Authority based on the forecasted revenues and projected expenditures. The FY 20 Budget: (1) ensures that all payment obligations are met; (2) allows timely management of the Authority's finances; (3) ensures operational services to the public are achieved; and (4) provides transparency to the public.

FISCAL IMPACT:

The proposed expenditures for FY 2020 are approximately \$360.8 million.

Proposed Fiscal Year 2020 Annual Budget

The proposed Fiscal Year (FY) 2020 Annual Budget is prepared for a 12-month period, July 1, 2019 to June 30, 2020.

The Annual Budget outlines the revenues expected to be earned and expenses expected to be incurred for FY 2020. The purpose of the Annual Budget is to predict the financial position of the Authority based on the forecasted revenues and projected expenses, and ensure that all payment obligations are met. The Annual Budget authorizes the funding for the upcoming fiscal year.

The FY 2020 Annual Budget consists of three (3) components: Operating Expenses of \$52.8 million, Debt Service of \$106.6 million, and Capital Expenditures of \$201.4 million.

The Traffic & Revenue consultant provided a forecast of revenues and transactions based on current toll rates in effect, traffic trends, anticipated growth, construction impacts, and economic factors. Toll revenues are reported on an accrual basis when earned. SunPass Revenues are recorded by file process date. Toll-By-Plate revenues are reported on a cash basis when received. FY 2020 forecasted toll revenue is \$226.2 million, and provides for a Frequent Driver Rewards Program (FDR Program) of \$3.5 million.

SUMMARY EXPLANATION AND BACKGROUND:

This FY 2020-2024 Work Program provides funding for the following improvements:

- The final design and construction of the SR 836 Southwest Extension/Kendall Parkway including all improvements to local streets. The FY 2019-2023 Work Program already funded the project development and right-of-way phases of the project.
- In order to include the construction of the SR 836 Southwest Extension/Kendall Parkway a number of projects were defunded or deferred. Refer to the Variance Report attached for details.
- There is \$200.5 million (including \$9.3 million in contingency) programmed for FY 2020 of which 75% is currently under contract.

SMALL AND LOCAL BUSINESS PARTICIPATION:

Minimum SBE and LBE requirement of 10% and varies per contract.

MANNER IN WHICH REQUESTED ACTION ADVANCES MDX STRATEGIC GOALS:

Approval of this Five-Year Work Program will allow staff to continue to move forward MDX's goals of developing and delivering projects in support of MDX's mission to improve safety and mobility in Miami-Dade County.

Projects that are not under contract will not be advertised until funding is available.

A RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF THE MIAMI-DADE EXPRESSWAY AUTHORITY DECLARING THAT IN ORDER TO EXTEND THE SR 836 / DOLPHIN EXPRESSWAY FROM ITS CURRENT TERMINUS AT NW 137TH AVENUE IN THE VICINITY OF NW 12TH STREET TO SW 136TH STREET ALONG A PREFERRED WESTERN AND SOUTHERN ROUTE, AND TO **CONSTRUCT TRANSPORTATION AND ANCILLARY** FACILITIES THAT ARE INTEGRAL TO DEVELOPMENT OF A REGIONAL TRANSPORTATION PROJECT ("PROJECT 83618," ALSO KNOWN AS "SR 836 SOUTHWEST EXTENSION" AND "KENDALL PARKWAY") RECOMMENDED AT THE LOCATION, IT IS NECESSARY TO ACQUIRE INTERESTS IN REAL PROPERTY PURSUANT TO CHAPTER 348, PART I, FLORIDA STATUTES; DECLARING THAT ACQUISITION OF INTERESTS IN REAL PROPERTY TO CONSTRUCT PROJECT 83618 SERVES CRITICAL PUBLIC PURPOSES OF REGIONAL SIGNIFICANCE; AUTHORIZING THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR AND ALL OTHERS DESIGNATED TO ACT ON HIS BEHALF TO ACQUIRE INTERESTS IN REAL PROPERTY **THROUGH** NEGOTIATED **CONVEYANCE** OR **EMINENT** DOMAIN: AUTHORIZING THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR AND ALL OTHERS DESIGNATED TO ACT ON HIS BEHALF TO CONTRACT WITH EXPERT WITNESSES AND CONSULTANTS AND TO TAKE SUCH **FURTHER ACTIONS** AS ARE REASONABLY **NECESSARY**; **PROVIDING FOR** AND SEVERABILITY AND AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, the Miami-Dade Expressway Authority ("MDX") is a body politic and corporate, a public instrumentality, and an agency of the State of Florida established under the Florida Expressway Authority Act, as amended ("Act"), and Ordinance No. 94-215, adopted on December 13, 1994 by the Board of County Commissioners of Miami-Dade County; and

WHEREAS, through its adoption of the Act, the Florida Legislature enacted Part I of Chapter 348, Florida Statutes ("Part I"), declaring that there is a public need for the rapid construction of safe and efficient transportation facilities and providing a mechanism to effectuate construction of such transportation facilities; and

WHEREAS, as an expressway authority created and established under the Act, MDX may exercise all powers necessary, appurtenant, convenient, or incidental to the carrying out of the purposes described in Part I; and

WHEREAS, Part I authorizes MDX to acquire, hold, construct, improve, maintain, operate, and own an expressway system, and to construct additional expressways for the purpose of extending, expanding, and improving the expressway system which it currently operates; and

WHEREAS, MDX maintains a five-year work program that, among other functions, identifies and prioritizes infrastructure construction projects that extend MDX's highway system, increase its capacity, or improve mobility upon it, and which projects MDX anticipates funding over the next five years ("Five-Year Transportation Improvement Program," or "TIP");

WHEREAS, the TIP within MDX's FY2019-2023 Work Program, approved by the MDX Board on December 5, 2017, designates "SR 836 Southwest Extension" as a "funded program need" for "planning and right-of-way acquisition for a new expressway extension of SR 836 from NW 137th Avenue to the southwest Kendall area" and labels it as "Project 83618," which also is included in MDX's Long-Range Master Transportation Plan and Miami-Dade County's Metropolitan Planning Organization Long Range Transportation Plan;

WHEREAS, in conjunction with outside transportation consultants and through coordination with multiple public agencies and the public over a span of several years, MDX has overseen a Project Development and Environment Study ("PD&E") to evaluate the purpose of and need for Project 83618, and upon a finding of purpose and need, to evaluate relevant engineering, environmental, safety, fiscal, and demographic factors to recommend a preferred alignment for construction of Project 83618's transportation and ancillary facilities;

WHEREAS, the PD&E has been memorialized through a series of reports which (i) support the purpose of and need for Project 83618, (ii) evaluate projected benefits, detriments, and impacts associated with various alternate routes, configurations, and locations for construction of Project 83618's transportation and ancillary facilities, and (iii) designate a preferred route and recommended location upon which MDX should construct Project 83618's transportation and ancillary facilities ("PD&E Reports"); and

WHEREAS, the following findings, purposes, and objectives from the PD&E Reports establish the need for Project 83618 and have been evaluated and accepted by MDX:

- (a) to add additional capacity to the existing southwest Miami-Dade County roadway network, whose current inefficiency and unreliability does not adequately serve existing or expected demand within the Urban Development Boundary;
- (b) to provide local and regional connectivity by linking residential communities located in southwest Miami-Dade County to areas of major

employment, education, and commerce via a new north-south corridor that will connect to existing expressways north and east of the project area;

- (c) to improve local and regional mobility throughout southwest Miami-Dade County by creating additional and widened connections to existing major east-west arterials that currently operate above capacity, thereby reducing chronic congestion;
- (d) to implement express transit, multi-modal travel, and updated transportation technologies that will promote local and regional connectivity and mobility; and
- (e) to create a transportation network that will enhance safety by reducing congestion and travel time, enhance the movement of emergency responders, and augment hurricane evacuation.

WHEREAS, subject to additional analysis and evaluation, MDX accepts the PD&E Reports' findings, purposes, and objectives regarding projected benefits and impacts associated with various alternate routes, configurations, and locations for Project 83618's transportation and ancillary facilities, and accepts the PD&E Reports' conclusions and recommendations regarding the preferred route and recommended location upon which Project 83618's transportation and ancillary facilities should be constructed;

WHEREAS, MDX has adopted a Property Acquisition Policy which authorizes it to acquire any interest in real property that it deems necessary for the fulfillment of project goals, and delegates authority to the Executive Director, or his designee, to acquire real property under Section 348.0008 ("Acquisition of Lands and Property"), Florida Statutes, through negotiated conveyance or the power of eminent domain;

WHEREAS, under the terms of Part I, MDX may acquire such rights, title, or interest in private or public property by gift, devise, purchase, or condemnation by eminent domain proceedings as it deems necessary to fulfill its powers and purposes under the Act; and

WHEREAS, it is necessary for MDX to exercise its authority under Part I to acquire interests in real property at specific locations for the purpose of constructing Project 83618's transportation and ancillary facilities along a preferred route and at a recommended location.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE MIAMI-DADE EXPRESSWAY AUTHORITY:

Section 1: The recitals contained in the preamble to this Resolution are incorporated by reference herein.

- Section 2: It is declared that it is necessary to acquire, through negotiated conveyance or the power of eminent domain, interests in real property for construction of Project 83618's transportation and ancillary facilities along a preferred route and at a recommended location and that such acquisitions serve a public purpose, to wit:
 - (a) to add additional capacity to the existing southwest Miami-Dade County roadway network, whose current inefficiency and unreliability does not adequately serve existing or expected demand within the Urban Development Boundary;
 - (b) to provide local and regional connectivity by linking residential communities located in southwest Miami-Dade County to areas of major employment, education, and commerce via a new north-south corridor that will connect to existing expressways north and east of the project area;
 - (c) to improve local and regional mobility throughout southwest Miami-Dade County by creating additional connections to existing major east-west arterials that currently operate above capacity, thereby reducing chronic congestion;
 - (d) to implement express transit, multi-modal travel, and updated transportation technologies that will promote local and regional connectivity and mobility; and
 - (e) to create a transportation network that will enhance safety by reducing congestion and travel time, enhance the movement of emergency responders, and augment hurricane evacuation.
- Section 3: It is further declared that Project 83618 will have regional impact and involve collaboration of multiple regulatory agencies, so it is necessary to acquire, through negotiated conveyance or the power of eminent domain, interests in real property for securing applicable permits and for any other purpose that facilitates construction of Project 83618's transportation and ancillary facilities, and that such acquisitions also serve the public purpose referenced in Section 2 above.
- Section 4: The Executive Director and all others designated to act on his behalf are authorized to acquire interests in real property in accordance with MDX's Property Acquisition Policy, and to initiate eminent domain proceedings pursuant to Florida Statute Chapters 73 and 74, and Part I, and to file petitions, pleadings, affidavits, declarations of taking, and all other documents authorized by Florida Statute or rule of court to acquire interests in real property for Project 83618.
- Section 5: The Executive Director and all others designated to act on his behalf are authorized to contract with engineers, real estate appraisers, title examiners, certified public accountants, counsel, and other expert witnesses and consultants in connection with efforts to acquire interests in real property.

Section 6: The Executive Director and all others designated to act on his behalf are authorized to take such further actions as are reasonably necessary to fully accomplish the purposes hereinabove directed.

Section 7: If any section, paragraph, clause, or provision of this Resolution shall be held to be invalid or ineffective for any reason, the remainder of this Resolution shall continue in full force and effect, it being expressly found and declared that the remainder of this Resolution would have been adopted despite the invalidity or ineffectiveness of such section, paragraph, clause, or provision.

Section 8: This Resolution shall take effect immediately upon its adoption, and any provisions of any previous resolutions in conflict with the provisions herein are superseded.

Transportation Improvement Program

Project #11212 – SR 112/NW 37th Avenue Interchange The project has been deferred indefinitely. Appraisals are underway for a potential swap of Parcels.

Project #83611 – SR 836 – Interchange Improvements at I-95

Notice to proceed was issued on July 18, 2018 to Archer Western-De Moya Joint Venture (CJV). The contract duration is 4 years and the project limits begin west of NW 17th Avenue on SR 836 and continue through the SR 836/I-395/I-95 (Midtown) Interchange along I-395 to the MacArthur Causeway Bridge. The limits on I-95 are from NW 8th St to NW 29th St. Design is ongoing for various stages of the work with several bridges ready to be released for construction. The CJV has mobilized near the 17th Ave Interchange and have begun foundation work for the bridges at the western end of the corridor and to complete the area that was the eastern end of the MDX 83628 Project. The CJV has also shifted the mainline to the outside lanes in order to begin demolition operations in the median between 17th Ave and the MDX toll plaza and to remove parts of the median barrier wall in preparation for a future traffic shift. Ongoing coordination is underway with the CJV for ITS, lighting maintenance and utility locates. In addition, coordination is being carried out with the Miami-Dade County and the City of Miami for right of way, permits, and property issues.

Project #83618 – SR 836 Southwest Extension (Kendall Parkway)

Four different alternatives for two corridors are being analyzed. The CDMP amendment necessary for the project was approved by the Miami Dade County Commission in September of 2018. Drafts for the Project Environmental Impact Report (PIER) and the Preliminary Engineering Report (PER) were completed and released

for public display in November 2018. The recommended alternative has been identified. Documents supporting information summarized in the PEIR and PER for the different disciplines were also completed at the end of November. Public Hearing for the PD&E project took place on December 13th, 2018. Public Hearing Transcripts have been reviewed and comments provided. Comments from the Public are being gathered and revisions of documents have started.

Coordination has taken place between the PD&E consultant and MDX GEC in regards to the design concept of the segment along SR 836/Dolphin Expressway for the existing segment west of SR 821. Three lanes along this segment is required. The Traffic Analysis for Phase II 2050 volumes (arterials and freeway) have been reviewed, also preliminary analysis for arterials and freeways have been developed. MDX GEC has submitted comments.

Coordination with FDOT regarding the SW 88th Street/Kendall Drive BRT PD&E Study is still on-going. Coordination with MDC RER in support of the project's CDMP amendment filing is still on-going.

MDX GEC on behalf of MDX has submitted the Army Corp (ACOE) permit application for the project. MDX GEC prepared and submitted the project master plan to Miami Dade County for approval as required by the ILA.

MDX GEC submitted the initial master plan document to Miami Dade County on April 30th, 2019.

Environmental coordination is on-going with the County, South Florida Water Management District, US Army Corps of Engineers and the US Fish and Wildlife Service.

The Design-Build RFP package development for Segment 1 (SR 836 to SW 157th Avenue) is on-going.

The PD&E Study is anticipated to be completed by the end of June.

Project #83628 – SR 836 Operational, Capacity and Interchange Improvements

Odebrecht Construction Inc. (OCI) continues to work under Phase II of the Traffic Control Plan (TCP) and is currently working on the reconstruction of the median barrier wall and placing asphalt friction course between NW 57th Ave and NW 27th Ave. This work includes full depth reconstruction of the inside shoulders in both directions on SR 836 from NW 57th Ave to NW 17th Ave. This work is necessary to accommodate the XT Lanes for Express Bus service from the Dolphin Station Park and Ride to MIA and downtown.

NW 57th Ave Interchange to NW 45th Ave Ramps:

At the NW 57th Ave Interchange, OCI continues working on the completion of signing, signalization and cleanup prior to the placement of the final asphalt friction course.

$\underline{\text{NW }}$ 45th Ave Ramps to NW 42nd Ave (Le Jeune Rd) Interchange:

OCI has completed the demolition of the existing median barrier wall and continues to work on the reconstruction of the inside shoulder prior to asphalt placement and permanent lighting installation. Guardrail installation, signalization, ITS, sodding and drainage inspections are ongoing throughout the interchange.

NW 42nd Ave (Le Jeune Rd) Interchange to 34th Ave Ramps (14th St):

From NW 42nd Ave to NW 34th Ave, roadway construction operations continue through the inside lanes. The reconstruction of the new median barrier and the new inside shoulder for the final alignment at NW 14th St is in final configuration and the new ramp to northbound Le Jeune Rd/MIA has been opened to traffic. OCI continues to work on miscellaneous construction activities in this area prior to the placement of final asphalt friction course.

34th Ave to 17th Ave Interchange:

Eastbound, OCI completed the widening of the outside lane. Earthwork grading operations continue at all four quadrants of the NW 27th Ave Interchange. OCI continues working on Phase II of the traffic control plans to allow for the reconstruction of the new median barrier wall.

From NW 17th Ave to NW 27th Ave westbound, OCI continues to work on the construction of the new bridge and on ramp from NW 17th Ave southbound to westbound SR 836. This ramp is scheduled to be completed by the end of July 2019. Eastbound, OCI completed the widening of the bridges over NW 22nd Ave and NW 11th St and continues the work on bridge deck replacement for the bridge over NW 11th St.

As of April 2019, the estimate of work completed is 91.76% with 98.87% of the allowable contract time used.

Project #83629 – SR 836 – Interchange Modifications at 87th Ave

Odebrecht Construction, Inc. (OCI) continues in work areas defined under the Traffic Control Plans Phase 2 condition for the eastbound direction of the expressway and Phase 2A for the westbound direction. OCI continues to work on the grading and paving operations for the off ramp going westbound from SR 836 to southbound NW 87th Ave. OCI continues paving operations for several areas of SR 836 and ramps, in anticipation of upcoming traffic shifts. Demolition of the remaining portion of the last existing bridge over 87th Ave has been completed. OCI continues to work in the Toll Gantry area at the on-ramp from NW 87th Ave to eastbound SR 836. Work continues with grading and paving operations in this area. The new northbound 87th Ave to westbound SR 836 on ramp has been opened to traffic. OCI is working on the final grading of slope embankment and retention ponds east and west of 87th Avenue. At NW 12th St, OCI continues with landscaping and restoration of the private properties. A

traffic shift is scheduled for this month from 87th Ave to 84th Ave to complete the eastbound lanes. Signalization work is ongoing in the intersection of NW 84th Ave.

OCI continues working on the steel bridge for the on ramp from NW 12th St to westbound SR 836. On the westbound mainline OCI is preparing the outside lanes to perform a traffic shift in June 2019 to place traffic under the Phase 3 Traffic Control Plans. OCI continues the widening of NW 87th Ave under the new bridges. Sidewalks, curbs, gutters, and paving operations are ongoing.

As of April 2019 (last invoice), the approximate estimated work completed is 84% of work in place and 99% of the allowable contract time used.

Project #83634 – SR 836 Ramp Connections to HEFT

The Design-Build solicitation documents were updated to reflect the latest available information. The project's Design-Build advertisement is pending.

Project #87410 – SR 874 Ramp Connector FTE Bridges:

Bridge Substructure: All 20 foundations have been completed. A total of 19 out of 20 columns have been built and one is under construction. Also, 16 pier caps have been built out of 18 and one is under construction. The overall construction of the substructure is approximately 99% complete.

Bridge Superstructure: Pre-stressed beams have been installed on 6 spans of bridge 12 and 8 spans (all spans) of bridge 13. Bridge decks 12-1, 12-2, 12-3, 12-4, 12-5, and all 8 decks corresponding to Bridge 13 have been poured. Contractor continued working on deck 12-6. Beams for span 12-7 were installed. Overall superstructure construction is estimated at 63% complete. MDX Project:

On Segment 1 (SW 128th Street between 137th and 122nd Avenues) partial traffic switch was performed to begin

Work on Phase 2; activities ongoing on this phase are clearing and grubbing and drainage installation. Ongoing work on this segment also includes roadway subgrade and sidewalk construction. Construction continued on Segment 2 (128th Street from 122nd Ave to HEFT) including drainage installation as part of Phase 1A and, "cure" work on the Miami Vineyard Church, which is part of the right of way acquisition agreement. Water and sewer work on this segment is about 99% completed. Bridge construction on Segment 2 will continue when Phase 2 begins. On Segment 3 (SR 874 east of HEFT) the Contractor continued working on Bridge 13E, 4 out of 5 foundations have been completed and one more is in progress; also, 4 out of 5 columns have been completed. Pier cap construction is ongoing, caps 13E-5 and 3E-4 have been completed. Additionally, on this segment, construction of Bridge 13 railing and moment slabs are in progress. The Project also includes the widening of Northbound SR 874 from south of SW 104th Street (Killian Parkway) to provide three continuous lanes in the northbound direction.

Project #87413 – SR 874 Interchange at SW 72nd Street (Sunset Drive)

Traffic analysis data is being coordinated with FDOT for concurrence. The project's Informational Meeting and Public Hearing will be scheduled in calendar year 2019 after FDOT has provided concurrence on the Interchange Traffic Report operational analysis for SW 72nd Street.

Project #92404 – SR 924 Extension West to the HEFT

The project design components to be constructed by the Florida's Turnpike Enterprise were included in the Turnpike widening project advertisement on March 15, 2019. The South Florida Water Management District permit for the MDX work is being processed.

The NW 107th Ave standalone Design-Build package is being developed in anticipation of an advertisement when Miami-Dade County completes the right-of-way acquisition

as well as the removal of unsuitable subsurface material for construction. Coordination with Miami-Dade County is ongoing.

Project #92408 – SR 924/NW 67th Avenue Interchange

The project was re-activated and is in the project development phase. PD&E analysis is 90% complete. Draft PD&E Documentation is on-going. There is a Project Update Meeting scheduled with the Town of Miami Lakes in late June.

Project 10017 - SR 836 Toll System Conversion

All new toll zones that were installed under Project 83628 are in revenue collection. Coordination with the Civil Contractor and the Toll systems integrator for modifications within mainline toll zones at NW 57th Ave and NW 17th Ave is ongoing. Work on the civil infrastructure modifications continues, with TransCore scheduled to begin installation of the loops the week of June 10th, 2019. Coordination with the Civil Contractor and the Toll systems integrator for the new eastbound on-ramp zone from NW 87th Ave and relocated zone at the westbound off-ramp to NW 87th Ave is ongoing.

Capital Improvement Program

Project #40041, 40042 & 40043 ORT System Replacement on SR 924, SR 878 & SR 874

All toll zones on SR 874, SR 878 and SR 924 have gone live. TransCore is working on punch list items and project deliverables.

Project #40045 – Wrong Way Countermeasures

The design has been completed to implement the wrongway countermeasure at twenty-one (21) locations throughout the MDX System. GEC-B completed documents for the CEI procurement package. Advertisement for construction services is pending.

Project #50001 – Dolphin Station Park & Ride

As-builts and warranty packages have been reviewed and a copy was submitted to MDT. All Supplemental Agreements have been executed by MDX and the Contractor.

Renewal & Replacement Program

Project #30029 – System-wide Bridge Rehabilitation and Joint repairs

Final set of Plans and Bid Package was reviewed by Engineering and sent to Procurement in January 2019.

Project #30033 – Systemwide Pavement Markings Rehabilitation (Phase II)

MDX has decided to have the new MDX Wet Weather Pavement Markings installed in high priority areas of the system via a work order with FDI.

Project #30037 – Systemwide Class V Coating (Phase I)

Field reviews to address constructability issues and Temporary Traffic Control requirements are being performed. MDX has decided to combine this project with Project # 30043. The design process of the combined scope will begin in June.

Project #30041 – SR 878 LED Roadway Lighting

The lighting upgrade recommendation memorandum has been submitted and reviewed. Memorandum is to be updated to shift the lighting to the median.

Project #30042 - SR 836 Replacement of High-Mast Lights with LED

The lighting upgrade recommendation memorandum has been submitted and was presented to MDX. Final Design is complete and the Bid Package preparation is on hold.

Project #30043 – Systemwide ORT Gantries & Signature Structures Painting

MDX has decided to combine this project with Project # 30037. The design process of the combined scope will begin in June.

Project #30056 - Systemwide Infrastructure Modifications at Tolling Points

Final Acceptance was issued to the Contractor on January 9, 2019 upon successful completion of the Project. Project close-out is in progress. Final Payment has been made.
